WHO WE ARE

The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award is a global framework for non-formal education and learning, which challenges young people to dream big, celebrate their achievements and make a difference in their world. Through developing transferable skills, increasing their fitness levels, cultivating a sense of adventure and volunteering in their community, the Award helps young people to find their purpose, passion and place in the world. It operates in more than 130 countries and territories, helping to inspire millions of young people to take control and make their own choices.

Why the Award?

Non-formal education focuses on developing the wider 'soft' (or life) skills which help young people ensure they are ready for the world. When paired with a formal education, it provides a fantastic foundation for a young person to thrive.

This is where the Award comes to the fore. The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award encourages young people to develop the character, skills and confidence they need to improve themselves and their communities, by encouraging them to step outside their comfort zone and build positive habits that they will take with them for the rest of their lives.

Through the Award, young people can be empowered with not just the confidence but the desire to create meaningful change; to find their purpose, passion and place in the world. But non-formal education also benefits those young people who may not be able to access a full formal education – such as refugees, those living in poverty, young parents, those with physical or learning disabilities or those from an at risk or marginalised background.


How does the Award work?

Hundreds of thousands of dedicated people help to deliver the Award around the world, every day.

They do this through a simple but effective social franchise model. From correctional facilities, youth centres, national schools and sports clubs to the most prestigious private and international schools, the Award's framework can support and thrive in a multitude of different environments. Whilst the framework of the Award does not differ from country to country, the Award is licensed to operators around the world, to ensure it is nationally and culturally relevant to each and every young person involved. In many countries the Award is delivered via licensed National Award Operators.

In Romania the Award is delivered by The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award Romania Foundation, offering the programme to institutions and youth organisations that work with with young people between 14-24 year old. The outcome for these and many more young people is extraordinary: it transforms their lives.

By encouraging young people to learn new skills, get physically active, volunteer within their communities and discover a sense of adventure outside the classroom, the Award helps young people to unlock their potential. Using the Award framework and with the support of adult volunteers, participants develop their own bespoke programme, as they work towards achieving the internationally recognised Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards.



Key three areas of focus in 2022

Expanding our Access

Nationally our team continued to develop partnerships that would improve access for new and diverse groups of young people to access the Award. Our primary focus: remove barriers to participation. We worked to strengthen our resources and virtual platforms by making our framework more accessible to all. As we work to expand access to diverse communities our aim is to work in partnership with them to build a stronger community impact. Building key strategic partnerships that would enable us to maximize our impact to expand access was critical. With the support of our main sponsors ensured that we had the resources and tools to expand into key newcomers.

Extending our Reach


Bringing the Award to new geographical areas and audiences enhanced through our transformed national structure. By realigning our internal structure we strengthened and grew our staff team, enabling us to reach new communities across the country.

Thanks to our partnership with the Award Foundation and UNICEF through the Stand by Me project, we were able to enhance our social infrastructure and provide training and mentorship workshops for displaces Ukrainian communities focusing on mentorship and Award delivery. This was especially important during the conflict in Ukraine to ensure that no young person was left behind. We also built strong regional partnerships which would see funds directly impact work in local communities. With thanks to UNICEF and Award Foundation World Fellows we were able to expand our reach across the provinces and impact the lives of more young people.

Strengthening our Impact

Illustrating our impact and the value the Award brings to communities across Romania was an important focus in 2022. We recognized with our merger we needed to continue to communicate the value the Award brings and how our impact is strengthened in this new organizational structure. The Award Global Forum hosted in October in Cluj Napoca engaged all our stakeholders, bringing them along with us during every aspect of our journey to building a stronger unified Award.

In 2022 we began to convey the impact the Award framework has on building the infinite potential of young people long after they have completed the Award. In 2022 we hired a Gold Award Holder to manage the Virtual Award Centre and leverage their experience to illustrate the impact the Award continues to make in the lives of people.



JOIN STAND BY ME PROJECT AND MAKE A DIFFERENCE

The Duke of Edinburgh International Award together with its local programs in Romania, Slovakia and Cech Republic have joined forces with UNICEF to provide community engagement support in response to the humanitarian crisis in Ukraine.

The Award in the Czech Republic, Romania and Slovakia are initiating the scheme and nationwide network to facilitate communication and mitigate the impact of the war in Ukraine on young people.

While other organisations lead on the humanitarian response – and in many areas Award participants and volunteers are already actively involved in supporting these efforts – the Award's focus is on the medium to long-term disruption and dislocation to families and individual lives. To support children and young people to deal with the huge impact on their mental health and wellbeing.

The Stand By Me initiative is leveraging the Award's framework for non-formal education as a tool for community cohesion, transforming access in a matter of safeguarding young people at risk. With its Buddy Up scheme, Ukrainian displaced young people aged between 14 – 24 are able to team up with Romanian buddy and together to set goals, to regularly get active, volunteer in their communities, develop skills, plan and undertake an adventurous journey.



UNICEF recognises the importance of engaging with young people as partners in any humanitarian and crisis response. Whether it is war, epidemics, natural disasters or climate action – young people have demonstrated their capacity to make a unique contribution to the lives and wellbeing of their peers, families and communities.

The joint UNICEF and Award Stand by Me programme helps create connections and a sense of belonging and social cohesion between Ukrainian and host-community youth.

It is a programme that builds the skills and competence of young people and also builds bridges of peace and understanding among peoples".



About Olena Koval

Olena Koval is a Ukrainian
Cultural Mediator now
based in Cluj Napoca,
Romania. She acts as a
UN volunteer for WHO
Romania, supporting the
Ukrainian community
where she is based.

Olena is a psychologist, specialising in trauma therapy. She used to have a private practice in Kyiv, working with adults and teenagers. Her working methodologies are based on neuroscience and art therapy, also including mindfulness practices.



Currently she is delivering trauma therapy groups for women and mental health support education for adolescents.

She has become a valuable informal ambassador for the Award Programme in Cluj and she has supported the Romanian DofE team to reach members of the Ukrainian community in Cluj, from teachers and young people to parents and other members of the community.

We discussed about her life before the war, what did it mean to leave her country, why did she choose Cluj or what it means for her to be a cultural mediator in these difficult times.

Virtual Award Centre

We have launched the Virtual Award Centre during the pandemics to support the Award Participants who had lost contact with their Leaders when youth groups and schools were no longer meeting in person.

This enabled us to increase access and raise impact, diversity, and relevance of the Award nationwide for over 1000 young people in the following period, with the special involvement of young Award Ambassadors, Gold Award holders who became Award Leaders and inspired them through their journey. This model proved effective for the regions where the Award is not physically present yet and therefore we are continuing to develop and further our reach through the Virtual Award Centre.







Extending the Award in North Transylvania

We were happy to continue this project, by extending the Award programme in Transylvania North region in order to improve access and reach 850 young people and train and support 220 adults as Assessors and Award Leaders in 3 years. Through this project our strategy was to be more innovative and ambitious in growing the numbers and diversity of young people participating in and achieving an Award, having a positive impact in the life of youth: guide them to excellence, discovery new skills, improving abilities, finding a job, offering them a professional orientation, a solution for society integration, an open door for international studies.






In 2022 The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award Romania Foundation provided the Award to young people from Oltenia through the Apprentice Electrician project, carried out by Distribuție Oltenia.

More than 30 teachers and members of the Oltenia Distribution team joined the program as Award Leaders, Supervisors and Assessors. and supported almost 100 young people in the electrical field, a field which lacks specialists, as well as development opportunities for young people fresh out of school.

Global Award Forum 2022

Our Foundation has successfully hosted the 14th Forum of The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award Association in October 2022 in Cluj Napoca, with the special presence of HRH Prince Edward The Earl of Wessex; Her Majesty Margareta, Custodian of Romanian Crown; HRH Prince Radu of Romania; HRH The Prince Guillaume of Luxembourg, who welcomed the attendees from over 130 countries and territories and discussed and advocated for the importance of non-formal education and learning.

Coming together in person for the first time since the pandemic, Forum 2022 will forever be remembered as a truly unique event in the Award's collective history. Being able to travel internationally once again, to work side-by-side, planning the strategic direction of the Award and improving access, reach and impact for years to come, is something we shall never take for granted again.

This was also the first time the Association had met in a non-Commonwealth country. The Award in Romania warmly welcomed all guests and were the hosts of 9 events in 5 days, in Cluj Napoca. The agenda was formed from a series of Plenary sessions, interactive workshops, Royal Galas, Ceremonies and field visits which gave delegates the opportunity to see the Award in action at local level. It also offered the opportunity to gain a better understanding of a young person's experience in this part of Romania today and see first-hand some of the positive impacts the Award can have on young people and their communities. Five Award Centres were visited: • Academia de Fotbal Viitorul Cluj • Elf High School • János Zsigmond Unitarian High School • Royal School in Transylvania • Transylvania College.

Forum 2022 was the first time the Award family had gathered since the passing of our Founder, HRH, The Duke of Edinburgh. The Award is, and will forever be, his living legacy. To mark Prince Philip's passing and celebrate his legacy, HRH The Earl of Wessex and Forfar, John May and Lord Paul Boateng led attendees through a journey of his life and legacy. 


