We had a unique opportunity in 2023; it was the year after hosting the Global Forum and having the whole Award family in Romania, including HRH, the Duke of Edinburgh, Prince Edward. Since 1963, we have empowered young people to develop their infinite potential by setting and achieving goals with the support of a mentor through our non formal educational framework.

With the support of adult mentors, The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award encourages young people to pursue their passions and believe in the power of their potential.

Whilst the framework of this internationally recognised accreditation remains the same around the world, participants select self-identified areas of interest to pursue. Each young person develops their own unique Award programme that builds the character, skills and confidence needed to improve themselves and their communities.

Measuring social impact enables an organisation to understand how its activities have led to positive and negative effects for its stakeholders. By measuring impact, the organisation can then truly start to manage it.





OPENING THE OPPORTUNITY FOR DIRECT INVOLVEMENT OF THE COMPANIES

STAND BY ME PROJECT

Stand By Me, a collaborative effort led by the International Foundation of the Award alongside National Foundations in Romania, Czech Republic, and Slovakia, with support from UNICEF ECARO, aims to aid Ukrainian-displaced communities in these countries.

Its primary goal is to implement the Award framework to facilitate the integration of young Ukrainians into local communities, fostering cultural exchange. Moreover, the initiative equips organizations, hubs, and schools with a systematic method for engaging youth through the Award programme, providing essential resources for integration and cultural awareness. Stand By Me embraces both Ukrainian and local youth, advocating for inclusivity and solidarity across borders.



Virtual Award Centre

Virtual Award Center is a new approach to improve access for young people and marginalised groups to join the Award and have digital tools in communities where the program is not delivered.

We launched the Virtual Award Centre to support young people who had lost contact with their Award Leaders when youth groups and schools were no longer meeting in person. We connect young people with trained and vetted Award Leaders remotely to complete their Award activities.

They find local opportunities for the Skills, Service, and Physical Recreation sections, and they work with the guidance of their Award Leader to plan and execute the Adventurous Journey and Gold Residential Project sections.

Completing the Award this way does require the participant to be self-motivated and to seek out opportunities themselves.



Extending the Award in Transylvania

Making the Award accessible for Hungarian communities has been one of our main goals within the Transylvania Project this year. Extending by signing new units, training adults, organising networking events, translating the ORB platform and the Leaders manual into their mother tongue, and offering constant support were some of our main objectives.

Shifting the focus from urban areas to rural ones in order to improve the access for young people from these marginalised communities has meant to include schools from small towns across Transylvania region where young people from the area are gathered for high school studies.

Supporting them with our resources and offering individual guidance according to each unit's specific needs to help their youngsters in completing the Award is our main direction.

For me, this program recognizes students who engage in a wide range of activities that balances out their academic studies.




